# ONLINE SAFETY

Currently there is a lot of media interest in a number of online trends, specifically news outlets are referencing something called the MOMO Challenge. Although a lot of the information about the MOMO Challenge is rather concerning, the number of reported cases of children harming themselves because of this is understood to be extremely low. The challenge has alleged to have been tentatively tied to three cases in Asia and South America, but there is nothing that proves that it was a direct key factor in these cases.

### Current Advice from CEOP

Advice to parents - you should work to create a positive relationship with your children around their internet use; closely supervising younger children's online access; and crucially, ensuring your children feel they can tell you (or another trusted adult) if they ever encounter anything worrying. Parental controls go some way to protecting children from accidentally viewing disturbing content but are unlikely to prevent it in many cases, for example when content has been deliberately spliced into content aimed at children.

Inappropriate content should be reported direct to the online service it appears on.

- If you feel unsafe for any reason, get to a safe location quickly and inform somebody you can trust.
- If you feel in danger, dial 999 immediately and ask for Police"
