# **SCHOOL SURVEY**

Before the half term holiday, we put out a survey to parents and asked for your feedback on our school. We received 185 replies and would like to thank everyone who took the time to complete a form. The vast majority of feedback we received was very positive, please see below;

"My son loves coming to school every day to see his friends and teachers"

91.8% of parents say their child is happy at this school. 9 out of 10 parents would recommend our school to others.

91.9% say their child feels safe at school.

"My child feels well supported at Banks Lane, the teaching staff are approachable and always keep me informed"

"Great school, keep up the good work"

"It's nice to see staff seeing the children into school with a hello, extremely happy with this school"

86.5% agree we have a good range of subjects available

9 out of 10 of parents said their child does well at our school.

"My child started not too long ago in year three and has been made to feel so welcome, they come home with a massive smile on their face every day and talk about how much they like their teachers and friends"

Although the positive feedback is fantastic some parents also shared some views on where they believe improvements can be made;

"I feel communication with home could be much better. I don't know what they're learning or how they are progressing until parents' evenings and I could be targeting support at home better if I knew."

"I feel I could be better informed about my children's progress" 21.6% were unsure whether we support their child's wider development.

We are proud of the offer we have here at Banks Lane. The purpose of our surveys is to ensure you are also happy with our provision and to see where improvements can be made. As a result of the completed forms we can see the main concern parents have are not being made aware of our proposed curriculum and not being kept informed of their child/ren's progress. This is something we will address in the coming weeks and we will send out further information once complete.

Are you a parent of a child currently in year 6 who will be moving on to secondary school? Do they have an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) or are they undergoing an EHCP needs assessment?

If so, we are hosting an information event with the EHCP/SEND Team about moving on to secondary schools. There will be an opportunity to hear from the Local Authority and well as the SENDIAS Service so you will know what to expect during the coming school year and when certain things should happen i.e., consultation with secondary schools and when your child's EHCP will be amended.
